Atogepant information sheet

Atogepant is part of the Gepant group of drugs used for migraine prevention in adults. It blocks a molecule called CGRP which is implicated in the migraine mechanism. The dose is one tablet a day. As a rare side effect is drowsiness, it is best taken at night. You can use Triptans or other pain relievers if you have a breakthrough attack of migraine. The benefit of atogepant should be noticed quite soon, after one month.

Atogepant is generally well tolerated. Main side effects noted are:

- Constipation (7%)
- Nausea (7%)
- Drowsiness (5%)

Pregnancy and breastfeeding.
